

1. Is the museum you chose an art museum, an art gallery or a historical museum? What kind of pieces do you expect to find in it?
2. Read the museum presentation (the text below the name and the location of the museum). Does it say what type of art it collects? Does it give any type of cultural information?
3. Look at the image on top, then look at the bottom right corner. Is there an orange man-like figure in there? If so, you can click on it to see what the museum looks like on the inside (if there isn't, you can skip to the next question). Take a tour for 2 or 3 minutes. Does it look like any museum you have already been to? Is it what you expected? Is it different? How so? (Remember it is a 360 camera, so you can look at the ceilings, at the places behind the camera, zoom in and zoom out)
4. Go back to the main page. Scroll down a bit, you are going to see, after some especial highlights, the full museum collection. You can organize it 3 different ways (using the buttons on the left up corner): by the most searched pieces (first button that looks like a flame); by the chronological year of the pieces (clock icon) or by color (pallette icon). Choose the one you prefer and take a look at the pieces. You can click on them to zoom in and get more information, like the year it was produced, who the author is, what type of materials it uses, etc.
5. Choose the piece you liked the most (you and your partner may choose different pieces). Observe it, pay attention to the colors, textures, words or whatever characteristics it may have. Zoom in the most you can, then zoom out. Why does it appeal to you? What made you choose it among all the other possibilities? Write down the name of the museum, the name of the piece and the name of the artist.
