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"A number of items considered to be inimical to the <u>environment will be banned</u> on 1st January 2019, consistent with the <u>Government's vision to create the world's first climate</u> resilient nation, our **designation** as "<u>The Nature Isle"</u> and our **commitment** to protect <u>Mother Earth"</u>

"These will include the following: <u>plastic straws</u>, <u>plastic plates</u>, <u>plastic forks</u>, <u>plastic knives</u>, <u>styrofoam cups</u>, <u>styrofoam containers</u>." Skerrit said, **adding** that the necessary legislation to **enforce** the ban will **soon** be prepared.

He said the issue of solid waste management affects the perception of Dominica as the "Nature Island" and his <u>government</u> continues to grapple with the problem.

"In a previous budget address, I announced a decision to restrict the importation of non-biodegradable containers and plastic implements used in food service. This matter has not proceeded as quickly as we would have liked, as we wanted to ensure that we implemented that policy without compromising our obligations under the revised Treaty of Chaguaramas that governs the <u>Caribbean Community.</u>

"It is acceptable for a country to adopt measures which will help in the <u>preservation</u> of the <u>environment</u>," he added.
