"These will include the following: plastic straws, plastic plates, plastic forks, plastic knives, styrofoam cups, styrofoam containers." Skerrit said, **adding** that the necessary legislation to **enforce** the ban will **soon** be prepared.

He said the issue of solid waste management affects the perception of Dominica as the "Nature Island" and his government continues to grapple with the problem.

"In a previous budget address, I announced a decision to restrict the importation of non-biodegradable containers and plastic implements used in food service. This matter has not proceeded as quickly as we would have liked, as we wanted to ensure that we implemented that policy without compromising our obligations under the revised Treaty of Chaguaramas that governs the Caribbean Community.
